	Scottish Water is publicly owned unlike water companies in England.	
	Various useful statistics were given -	
	 Rainfall 13% more than 100 years ago & can come in surges. Scotland uses 1.5bn litres of water daily. Each person in Scotland uses 180 litres of water daily which is higher than the UK average. Scotland has just under 100 000 km (60 000 mls.) of pipes. 87% waterways are rated as 'Good' or better. 25% reduction in environmental incidents; also 10% reduction in flooding. incidents. Introduction of 'Top Up Taps' thereby greatly reducing no. of water bottles. Carbon footprint 6% less last year compared to previous year. Future projects including using wastewater to generate 'hydrogen' electricity.

	"Does Scottish Water know if there is any professional body from whom companies manufacturing wipes etc.need authorisation before they can be produced? Currently, there is increasingly problems in sewage systems with blockages as a result of items being incorrectly disposed."

	"Many thanks for submitting a question to Scottish Water's Annual Consultative Meeting (ACM) 29/08/23.	
	Items being incorrectly flushed is a problem that Scottish Water deals with on a daily basis. We have invested in several public information and behaviour change campaigns to tackle this issue. The most recent – the Nature Calls campaign – was launched in February 2022 which calls on customers to only flush the 3Ps	

(pee, poo & toilet paper). All other products should be put in the bin. Wet wipes containing plastic don't disintegrate when flushed and therefore appear in 80% of blocked pipes that our engineers have to clear. As many wipes contain plastic, they not only block pipes but harm nature. As part of the campaign, Scottish Water led the call to ban wipes made with plastic and we are delighted that the UK Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (DEFRA) is currently looking at legislation that makes this possible, with the Scottish Government also supportive of change.

The WRC (Water Research Centre) provide testing and certification for wet wipes that are plastic free; fully break down; and do not cause sewer or environmental damage. The "Fine to Flush" Specification (Water Industry Specification 4-02-06) is now recognised as the most effective means for manufacturers to showcase to customers their commitment to the environment through the adaptation of their toilet wipe products to meet this challenging standard. However, the Fine to Flush standard is currently only voluntary, not mandatory for manufacturers. This is why we believe an outright ban on non-conforming products will be the most effective solution".
