9. Ecology

Beavers

Cllr Illingworth facilitated a meeting on 21st March 2025 with attendees from K Jones, Nature Scotland, R Campbell-Palmer, Scottish Beaver Trust, R Forrester, Scottish Wild Beaver Group, D Stubbs & C Martin, P&KC Greenspace, plus 13 local residents, J Bruce (ECC chair), J Sloan (ECC secretary).

CIIr III

This meeting was a watershed event bringing together for the first time all parties with concerns. A very open meeting commenced as a single group with various points raised and discussed including ownership of South Bank and how to manage/maintain it in the longer term, erosion/drainage/flooding/slippage of land/removal of fallen trees/removal of debris in the water to mitigate flood risk along with protection for trees/ prevention of bank canaling of the water course/discussion to re planting of vegetation.

The group then walked down the river looking at old and current Beaver impacts, the groups tended to divide and re-group so several conversations were being had simultaneously, so a variety of issues were discussed and various outcomes were determined.

Nature Scotland made a request for any concerns/questions to be submitted by residents prior to the meeting (below are the questions submitted).

- 1. Exploding, unmanaged beaver population within the Deich Burn, and Earn catchment. Development of welfare issues.
- 2. Destruction of private property & Greenspace at Balmanno Park.
- 3. Lack of Accountability, Responsibility and Management of said Greenspace and said watercourse.
- 4. Flooding, collapsing embankments, course alteration, water quality, and siltation to Deich Burn.
- 5. Creation of obstacles in said watercourse and risk to infrastructure, services, and flood mitigation scheme.
- 6. Health and safety concerns & impact on human rights.
- 7. Inadequate legislation and financial impact.

A written response to the questions submitted is to be provided by K Jones (Nature Scotland).

ACTION/OUTCOMES planned and to be undertaken (Nature Scotland, Beaver Trust, and PKC Greenspace) following the meeting of 21st March included.

PKC to obtain the capacity to manage the south bank by.

- Admit that the land has been disponed by GS Brown to PKC as evidenced by a settlement in favour of GS Brown, or,
 - Obtain an authorised statement by GS Brown that they have no interest remaining in said land and that PKC may take on the land, or,
- Act on the assumption that by the passage of time, (being greater than 20 years), PKC are effectively the occupiers as they have undertaken all the greenspace management.

- PKC to take advice from SNH on beavers, their behaviour, habitat management and planning for the eventuality of beaver saturation / welfare crisis when there is inadequate sustainable food growth in this site.
- Granting the Beaver Trust contractors to SNH permission to assist in the planning and implementation of mitigating work.
- The Beaver Trust to generate support for a community group to undertake works on the south bank to protect and enhance the landscape.
- 2 water height monitors to be installed
- 1 more flow dam device to be installed
- Tree Survey be undertaken and a risk assessment to be undertake
- Greenspace PKC to remove trees that have fallen into the Deich Burn (Beaver Trust offered to do this work), declined by Greenspace
- PKC Flood Mitigation Team to engage to take part in the long term planning of the site. Scottish Water to be reminded of the dysfunctional manhole cover over the sewer pipe, which is discharging effluent into the Greenspace

JB requested that Cllr Illingworth as facilitator provide a note for this meeting. Suggestion to engage with MSP's and include PKC flooding team going forward.

Following the meeting (Friday 21st March) a resident subsequently submitted photographic evidence to Cllr Illingworth, of their garden following recent rainfall, evidencing there was no flooding as the banks were visible. However, as the water level is so high as a direct consequence of the beaver dams the drainage system within the garden no longer functions.

Further Discussion

<u>The Natural Environment (Scotland) Bill</u>, introduced on February 19, 2025 – this bill is currently at Stage 1 of the process to decide if it should become an Act.

This bill may offer an opportunity for the Scottish Government to make and change laws relating to the Environmental Impact Assessments regime and the Habitats Regulations, such as riparian residential owners in an urban environment ie Deich Burn. As the law stands it is written in relation to open agricultural, forestry and fisheries landscape environments.
