Response received from D Stubbs, PKC Greenspace (10/06/25) – abbreviated

This is already in hand, albeit progressing.

The Council maintain the ground on the south bank, Balmanno Park, but do not own it. It would appear that the adoption of the land from the developer by the former District Council failed for some reason c. 1989. There is no record of what happened unfortunately. It would seem prudent to explore transferring the land over to PKC but would not plan to make major changes on our side of the burn going forward.

The titles have been checked and there is no record of a disposal by GS Brown. PKC are working on the assumption that GS Brown will be willing to transfer ownership now. Site adoptions sit with another PKC team.
