Fairer Communities for All

Overview (shared via ECC facebook page)

Fairer Communities for All is a new process for distributing the Community Investment Fund and Locality Participatory Budgeting Fund, designed to make it easier for communities to shape local projects and influence how local funding is spent.

PKC are working closely with communities across Perth and Kinross to find real, practical solutions to the cost-of-living crisis. Together, we'll build fairer, stronger communities. By sharing your priorities and ideas to help with the cost of living, you can help shape the future of your community. We will collaborate with local community groups and organisations to bring your ideas to life.

To Date - Fairer Communities for All engagement survey. Communities across each council ward have shared their priorities, and local groups have come together to explore opportunities for projects that address the Cost of Living in their area.

Applications are now open for Fairer Communities for All - the process for distributing the Community Investment Fund and Participatory Budgeting Funds for 2025/26. This process will also be used to allocate funds from the NHS Charitable Foundation for Health and Wellbeing projects.

Warm Welcome funds have not yet been confirmed or allocated for this year. Communities are recommended that any projects aiming to provide warm spaces during the winter apply through the Fairer Communities for All process.

Next Steps:

- Projects will be notified by Friday 24th October if they have been successful in progressing to the public vote.
- Successful projects will receive further guidance on how to encourage local residents to vote.

Green Energy Projects P&K

A Joint CC Meeting was held Monday 15th September re influx of green energy projects within Perth & Kinross at Fowlis Wester Village Hall (JM attended)

JM Report

Present: Representatives from 10 c.c.'s plus Liz Smith, MSP and Cllr Frank Smith

J McColl of East Strathearn CC, arranged a meeting of CC's after he attended a joint meeting of 50 CC's and parliamentary representatives of Highland region, representing 72,000 residents. Their region, like ours, has seen a huge increase of scoping and planning applications involving wind and solar generation as well as battery storage.

Main points were:-

- 1. Lack of local democracy, where genuine concerns voiced by local communities are ignored by local and national bodies.
- The proliferation of planning applications in the area of Perth and Kinross, especially north and west of Perth. If approved the effect on rural communities in terms of a drop in tourism, blight on the landscape and possible devaluing of properties as well as the disruption and

damage to rural roads due to the huge amount of infrastructure necessary.

Several facts were given eg.

- The generation from already approved applications and those already in the pipeline was more than enough to satisfy government targets for 2030, therefore there is no need for any more sites at the moment. Most of our power goes south and most of the profits abroad.
- There is a huge cost in payments to production companies for shutting down turbines, when necessary, the hours this has happened in 2025 has far exceeded the whole of 2024.

In Conclusion:

- It was felt that there should be a moratorium on all planning applications regarding renewable energy until the government sets out a detailed, country wide strategy for renewable production instead of the piecemeal, scattergun approach at present. The immediate need is for modern, efficient infrastructure, transport and storage to cope with the energy already being produced, not for yet more production.
- That a united group who share the same interests and concerns may have more clout with government and council bodies.
