Cllr Illing

At the Planning & Placemaking Committee meeting on October 8th, Cllr Illingworth raised several critical points regarding the planning application under consideration. These comments are essential for ensuring that all relevant factors are considered in the decision-making process. The key areas of concern highlighted by Cllr Illingworth included:

- i. Education provision
- ii. Health services.
- iii. Construction traffic plan.
- iv. Flooding prevention;Water and sewage capacity
- v. That this site is not zoned for housing in LDP2.

These points underscore the importance of thorough planning and community impact assessment in the development process. Cllr Illingworth's comments reflect the views of the community to ensuring that any new developments align with local needs and regulatory frameworks.

Strategic Housing Investment Plan (SHIP) – Project to Deliver of 1000 Affordable homes across P&KC 2026 -2031

ECC's attention was drawn to 89 affordable homes at Captain's Glen contained within this plan. Email correspondence was sent to elected ward Councillors from ECC highlighting the lack of infrastructure in terms of Education & Health within Bridge of Earn, Cllr F Smith presented the concerns raised by EEC during the meeting of the P&KC Housing & Social Wellbeing Committee on 1st October 2025. ECC also engaged with N Sworowski, Place Strategies Manager & Chief Planning Officer. Correspondence/and replies shared via emails 1st and 3rd October shared with ECC Cllr's.

ECC considers that in the delivery of affordable housing it must be balanced with the necessary infrastructure to support new residents effectively. Further actions should aim at ensuring that any new developments are accompanied by enhancements in educational and health facilities in the community.
